### September RICHMOND

- Sep 1st 1635: Phone message from Bde. Clive Plumer Roberts complete T.A. will embody all action will be taken under Div. Scheme App. B.  
1730: H.Q. S.W. Sub Area orders to mobilize.
- Sep 3rd 1137: Air Raid Warning heard; all men except P.A.D. squad moved into trenches.  
1212: All Clear sounded.  
1330: Message received from S.W. Sub Area; "WAR HAS BROKEN OUT WITH GERMANY".
- Sep 4th 0246: Air Raid Warning; all men to trenches except P.A.D. squad.  
0320: All Clear sounded.
- Sep 6th 0634: Air Raid Warning.  
0900: All Clear signal.
- Sep 10th 1645: Message from Bde. Major; Inform all V.Ps. to detain all persons calling at a V.P. who cannot give a satisfactory account of themselves. Suspicious persons are to be detained and a telephone message to be sent to Eastern Command, Chief Constable Special Branch, New Scotland Yard immediately.
- Sep 17th 2200: Bde,. Major rang up; he would like C.O. to meet him at the Bull Hotel, Rochester tomorrow to discuss any difficulties with regard to V.Ps.; he is going to see the G.O.C. afterwards; if the C.O. is unable to do so, will he ring up at 0800 hrs tomorrow?
- Sep 18th 0025: Capt. Pullman reported accident at Chatham.
- Sep 19th Capt. Pullman reported that Cpl. Rosewell had died at 2135 hrs on 18.9.9.
- Sep 28th 1000: 5<sup>th</sup> Surrey Coy., A.T.S. left for 2<sup>nd</sup> Field Training Regt., R.A., Deepcut, Blackdown, Aldershot.
- Sep 30th 1230: Adjutant spoke to G.S.O. 3 12<sup>th</sup> Div. and gave strength at Chatham 16 Officers, 420 ORs.
