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CHATEAU D'EPREMESNIL

1700: Officer of Field Hygiene Company visited Chateau re. water problem. Arrangements made for two 300 gallon cask to be used in transporting water from village source.

1930: The following message received from 37 Inf. Brigade: two German parachutists landed between Amiens and Arras. British car stolen number unknown. Men very young. Wearing British officers' uniform. Detain if seen. Information circulated throughout Battalion. 1 OR admitted to hospital; struck of strength of the Battalion.

Apr 24th

Weather: wet, ground muddy; conditions in tents bad; temperature: humid. Letter from SC 37 Inf. Brigade: ref 37/FL/AQ: 12 Div. Employment Platoon, 2/6 Surreys to find 10 rank and file for first month. Letter from BM 37 Inf. Brigade: ref. 37/FI/G. Wearing of respirators not necessary unless an emergency arises; not to be published in orders.

0925: CO, Adjutant, OC "C" Company, TO and 1 OR (I, section) made a recce of area of duties to be taken over by "C" Company at Fecamp and Les Ifs. 1000: Major Blewitt telephoned on behalf of ADMS. Motor ambulance belonging to 4 L of C Motor Company detailed for our use. Attached to us but stationed in Foret de Montegeon; will report to us daily at a time to be fixed by MO. Whole place a sea of mud; men's boots not dry for last 10 days. Repairs impossible owing to the state of boots; no spares

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whatsoever.

Apr 27th

0812: Weather: unsettled, bright periods; temperature: mild. Mud beginning to dry.

0812: "C" Company moved from Battalion HQ to take up duties at Fecamp and Les Ifs. Marching out strength: 2 officers, 109 ORs including 1 OR attached from I Section

Boot question acute. 600 pairs of good boots handed in prior to Battalion's departure to this country, and now authority received to draw 20%. 0932: "C" Company arrived at Fecamp Took over billets at "Patronage et cercle – St Louis de Gonzague. Messing hall - 1st floor; men's quarters - 2nd and 3rd floors. Messing temporarily with 6 Company 2 Stevedores RE: cookhouse being built in grounds. Town Major called at Battalion HQ regarding training and digging areas. Gave permission for all pasture land including the Foret de Montegeon to be used for training as long as crops were not damaged. AndWill make arrangements for digging grounds.

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1459: CO, Adjutant, and 1 OR (I section) made a further recce of the aerodrome between Bleville and Octeville ref. sheet 4 Havre - Amiens pt L4731. Arranged to meet Commandant du Group Risachers and Commandant de la Compagnie de l'Air Juguers at 1000 hrs 2 May 40.

ROUELLES NEAR LE HAVRE

Apr 22nd -May 15th Battalion situated as follows; Battalion HQ and "B" Company at Rouellles. "A" Company at Froberville. "C" Company at Bolbec. "D" Company at Fecamp and Les Ifs. During this period the local defence of Le Havre was in the hands of the French and under the command of Admiral de Villaine. Lieutenant-Colonel Burgess was instructed by the OC Le Havre to make all liaison arrangements with the French Navy, Army and Air Force and to coordinate the whole local defence scheme. One company from the Battalion was to be held in readiness at all times to act as a mobile column. A warning was received that the Battalion had been selected to join the Saar Force.
